ABOUT STELLA MARIS COLLEGE

Stella Maris College, a Catholic minority institution of higher education for women, was founded on 15 August, 1947. Beginning in a small, one-storey building with 32 students in Santhome, Mylapore, the College was relocated in 1960 to its present campus "The Cloisters" on Cathedral Road in the heart of the city of Chennai. Today, the College has an enrollment of 6166 students from diverse backgrounds, communities and nations. The College is an autonomous institution affiliated to the University of Madras and is partly residential. It is under the management of the Society of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary, a Catholic, religious congregation founded by Blessed Mary of the Passion (Hélène de Chappotin) in Ootacamund, Tamil Nadu in 1877. Guided by her charism, the initiatives of the College arise from a sound philosophy of life based on faith in God and the contemporary reality of a pluralistic Indian society which is challenged by global ideologies and cultures. ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English is one of the oldest departments of the College; it began offering an M.A. programme in 1959 and a B.A. programme in 1963. It also offers Foundation/General English and Soft Skills courses to all students of the College.

At the undergraduate level the Department offers a variety of courses which range from genre-based to interdisciplinary. Regional literatures with their focus on cultural diversity, linguistic and contextual complexities and identity issues form the core of the undergraduate programme. In offering students an eclectic mix of subjects and approaches to the study of literatures and 'englishes', the Department has ensured the relevance of the discipline in today's world, while maintaining traditional strengths.

The postgraduate programme offers students a fine balance of traditional Anglo-American literature courses, along with contemporary writing from other related and emerging areas such as Women's Writing, Children's Fiction, Indian Literature in English and in Translation and Subaltern Literatures. The courses are designed to ensure that students receive grounding in key theoretical formulations, develop awareness of

The Department also offers specialised, skill-based courses such as English Language Teaching, Technical Writing and Children's Literature at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

As one of the oldest research departments of the College, the Department of English also offers a Ph.D programme. Scholars who register for the Ph.D programme are encouraged to work in a wide range of areas, both discipline specific and inter and multidisciplinary. At present, the department has four faculty who are recognised as Ph.D supervisors by the University of Madras.

The wide spectrum of courses reflects the varied specialisations of the faculty of the department. The objective of the Department is to equip students with critical, analytical, conceptual and communication skills which will enable them to work in many professions – teaching, journalism, publishing, translation, editing as well as research.

The B.A. English and Communication Skills degree programme (Shift II) was launched in the year 2018 in response to the growing need to combine literary studies with professional communication skills.

Through a range of texts from literatures across the globe, the programme intends to train students to engage critically with multiple genres and sensitise them to varied social contexts and multiple cultural and literary traditions. It also aims to provide students with opportunities to hone their communication skills in various professional contexts in a global environment that employs multiple modes of communication. While the courses cover a wide spectrum of skills for specific corporate and creative sectors, it also seeks to prepare students for higher studies in the discipline. Courses designed to equip students with communication skills include Presentation Skills, Academic Writing, Writing for the Media, English for Advertising, Technical Writing and Content and Copy Editing.


ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

PROCEDURE FOR PAPER SUBMISSION

Articles should be in Times New Roman, font size 12, double-spaced and submitted only in MS Word 2003/2007 version. All papers should follow documentation and citation style recommended by the MLA Handbook, 9th Edition. The abstract must not exceed 250 words. The full paper should not exceed 2500 words, including tables and references. The paper should comprise the following sections: Title Page, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Material & Methods, Findings & Results, Interpretation & Discussion and Conclusion. Authors should ensure that they use correct and complete references in their abstracts and presentation. Authors should submit manuscript through e-mail attachment to the review committee at **coninlit@gmail.com.** A manuscript number will be emailed to the corresponding author.

PUBLICATION

Selected papers will be published as chapters in a book with ISBN or as articles in peer-reviewed journals with ISSN. A hard copy of the published book, which contains the selected articles, will be mailed to the corresponding authors.
